

MOUNTING SUGGESTIONS:

Kawasaki Vulcan 2000 2004-2010 Solo and Passenger Seat

Hardware: Stock 6mm bolt x 2

White nylon washer x 2

Tools needed: 8mm wrench

Removal of stock seat:

- 1. Remove right seat cover with the ignition key, locate and pull the passenger seat release cable. Slide passenger seat forward and lift off the motorcycle.
- 2. Remove the two 6mm hex bolts mounting the solo to the fender. These will be used to install your new Mustang seat.
- Lift the solo up and slide back to remove. Replace the right side cover.

<u>Installation of Mustang seat:</u>



- Slide the solo's front bracket under the frame bracket at the base of the fuel tank.
- 2. Position the white nylon washers between the solo brackets and the fender and secure the solo to the fender using the stock 6mm bolts.
- 3. Slide the passenger seat back into the fender's U-bracket and push firmly until it clicks, signifying the seat is latched into position. Ensure this bracket is firmly engaged before riding.

Enjoy the comfort and custom look of your new Mustang seat!
